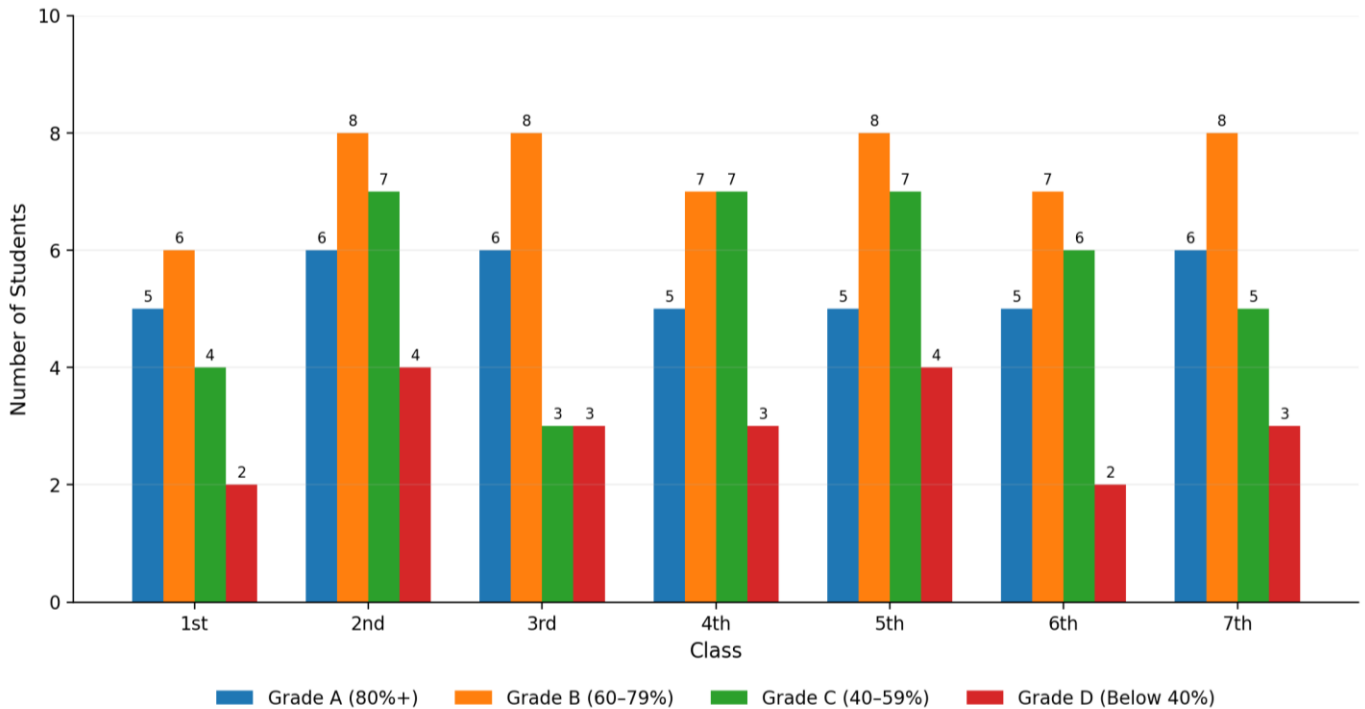

Difference After Project Support

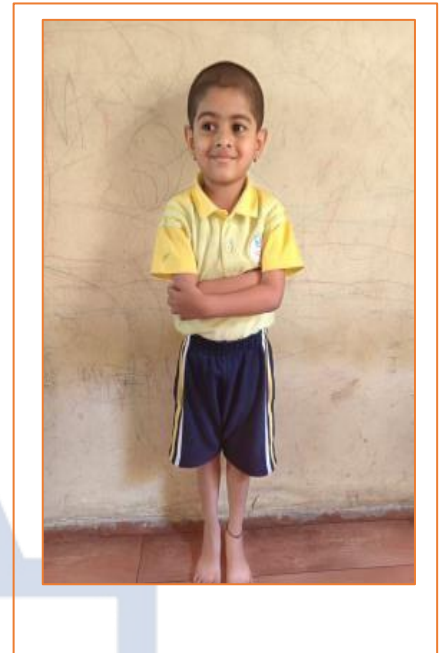

Swaraj's parents work in a company as contract-based workers. They earn limited money and could not afford private school fees for Swaraj. When Swaraj first joined, he could not read or write. He also did not know how to sit properly in class.

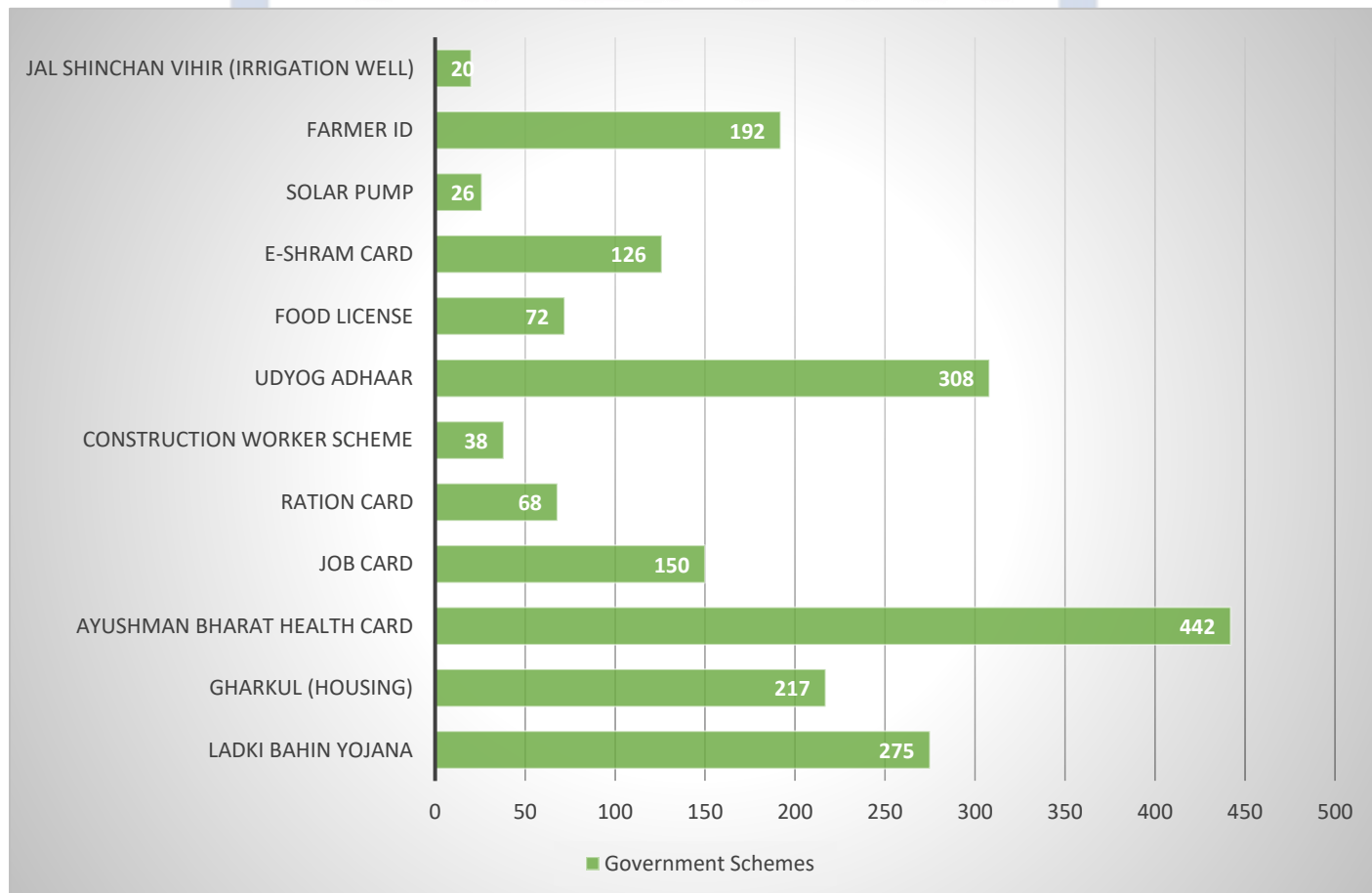

FROM A WIDOW TO A SELF-RELIANT FARMER

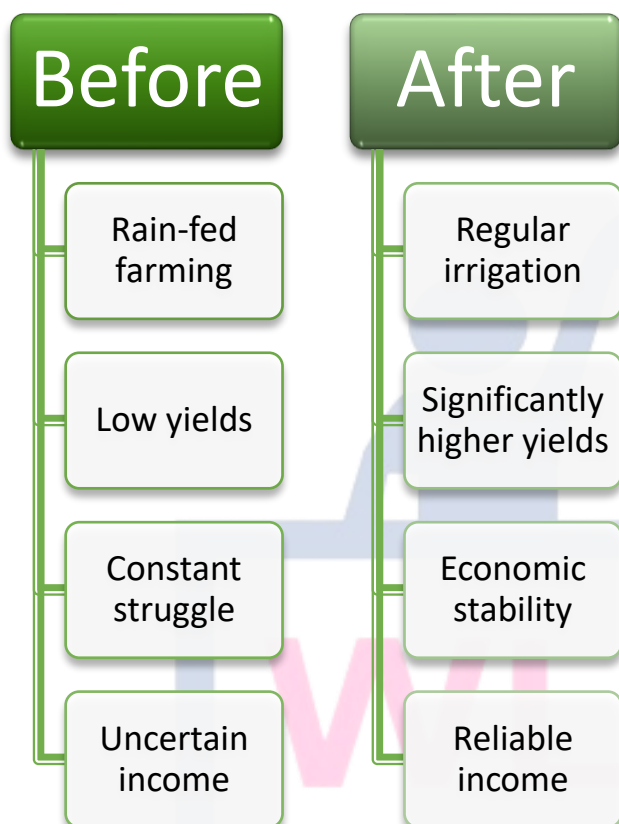


JOURNEY OF TRANSFORMATION

Mrs. Parvati Dashrath Mane, a widow living with her two children in Chandegaon, depended entirely on 3 acres of agricultural land. For years, her farm was rain-fed, producing very little and leaving the family struggling to meet basic needs.

Through the ESP Project, she learned about government schemes. With project team guidance, she applied for and received an Irrigation Well. However, without equipment to lift water, irrigation remained a challenge.

The project team then helped her apply for a 5 HP Solar Pump, which was sanctioned. This installation transformed her land entirely.

IMPACT

Now, she is able to meet her children's needs with dignity. Her story is a powerful example of how timely information, proper guidance, and access to government schemes can transform the life of a small farmer.

JOURNEY OF TRANSFORMATION

Mrs. Kalpana Sahebrao Payal lives an extremely challenging life with no family members to support her. Without land or regular wage work, she faced severe hardship.

Through the ESP Project, the team informed her about the Shravanbal Pension Scheme. The team helped her gather documents, prepared her application, and submitted it to the Tehsil Office in Beed. After follow-up, her application was approved.

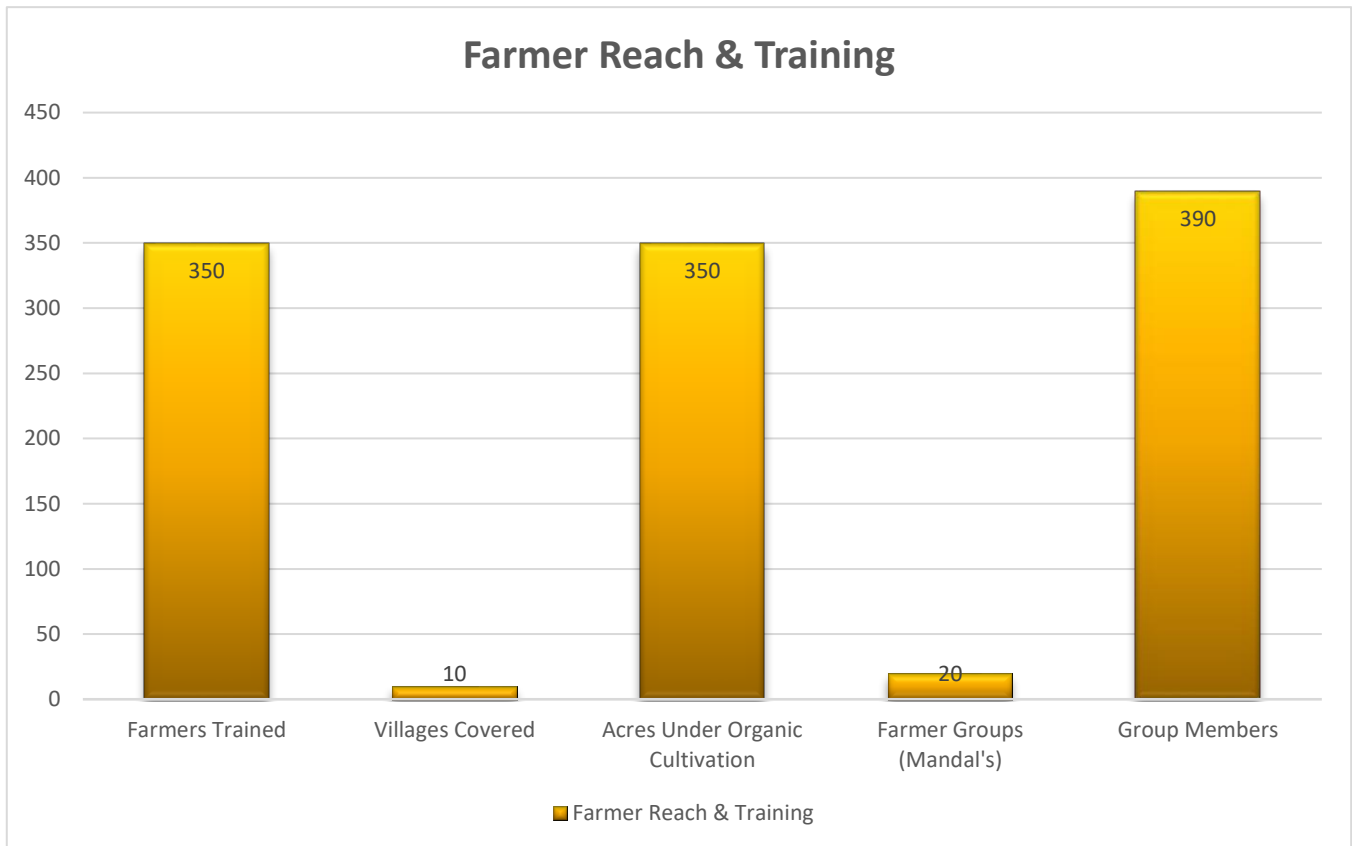

CASE STUDY

1. MR. RAJENDRA SHELKE

FROM NATURAL FARMING TO A BETTER LIVELIHOOD

Rajendra Shelke

Village: Devibabulgaon, Taluka & District Beed, Maharashtra

For the past several years, **Mr. Rajendra Shelke** has been practicing organic farming and cultivating a variety of crops using natural and sustainable methods.

During **2025–26**, he cultivated **chickpea (harbhara)** and **groundnut (bhuimug)** on his farm. He has chosen not to use chemical fertilizers or chemical pesticides for these crops.

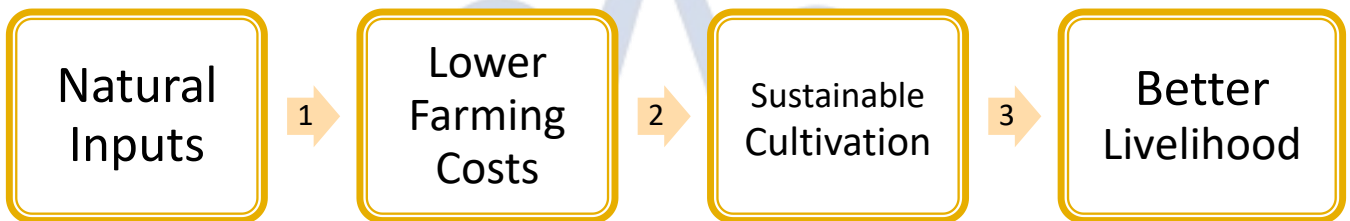
Instead, Mr. Shelke prepares **compost manure from agricultural and farm waste** generated on his own farm. He also prepares and uses **Dashparni Ark**, a natural formulation made from locally available plant materials, for pest management.

These practices have helped him **reduce farming costs while maintaining good crop production**. By making better use of natural resources available on his farm and reducing dependence on costly chemical inputs, he has been able to make farming more sustainable and economical.



Today, Mr. Shelke's experience demonstrates how **natural farming practices can reduce input costs, support healthier agricultural practices and contribute to improved livelihoods.**

2. MR. GANESH SHREERAM GADEKAR

MAKING EVERY DROP COUNT

Ganesh Shreeram Gadekar

35 years | Sultanpur Village, Beed District,
Maharashtra

THE CHALLENGE

For years, **Ganesh Shreeram Gadekar** faced the challenges of irregular rainfall and inefficient water use on his 2-acre farm. Limited and unpredictable water availability affected crop productivity and, consequently, his farm income.

THE INTERVENTION

With support through the Krushivibhag (Agriculture Department) government scheme, Ganesh was able to install a sprinkler irrigation system on his farm.

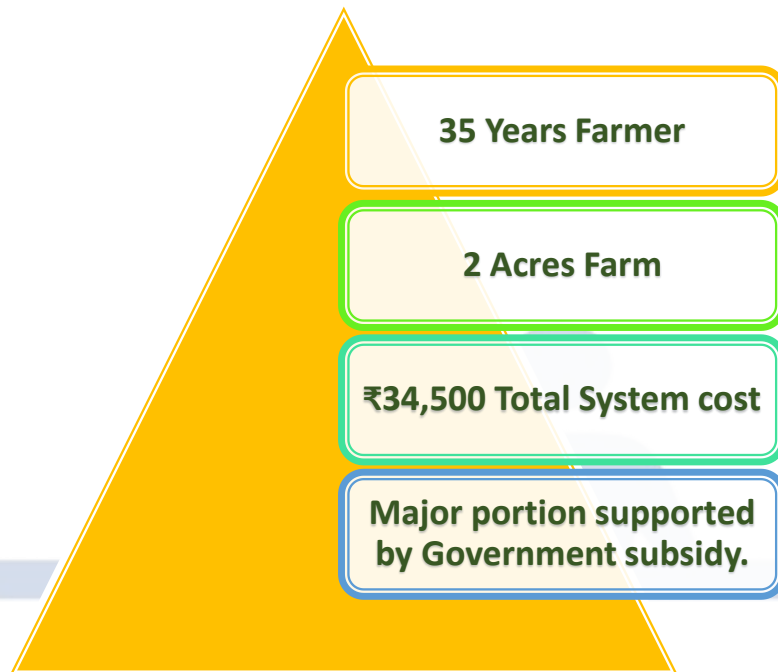
The total cost of the system was ₹34,500, with a major portion covered through the government subsidy. This significantly reduced Ganesh's financial burden, allowing him to access an efficient irrigation solution with only a small out-of-pocket contribution.

THE CHANGE

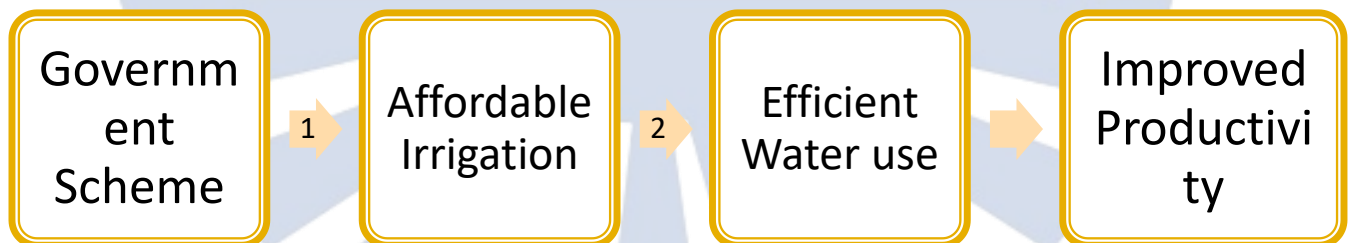
The installation of the sprinkler system helped Ganesh improve the **efficiency of water use** on his farm. He observed improvements in both **water management and crop productivity**, making his farming practices more practical and sustainable.

For a small farmer, access to appropriate irrigation technology can make a meaningful difference—not only in how water is used, but also in the potential productivity and economic sustainability of the farm.

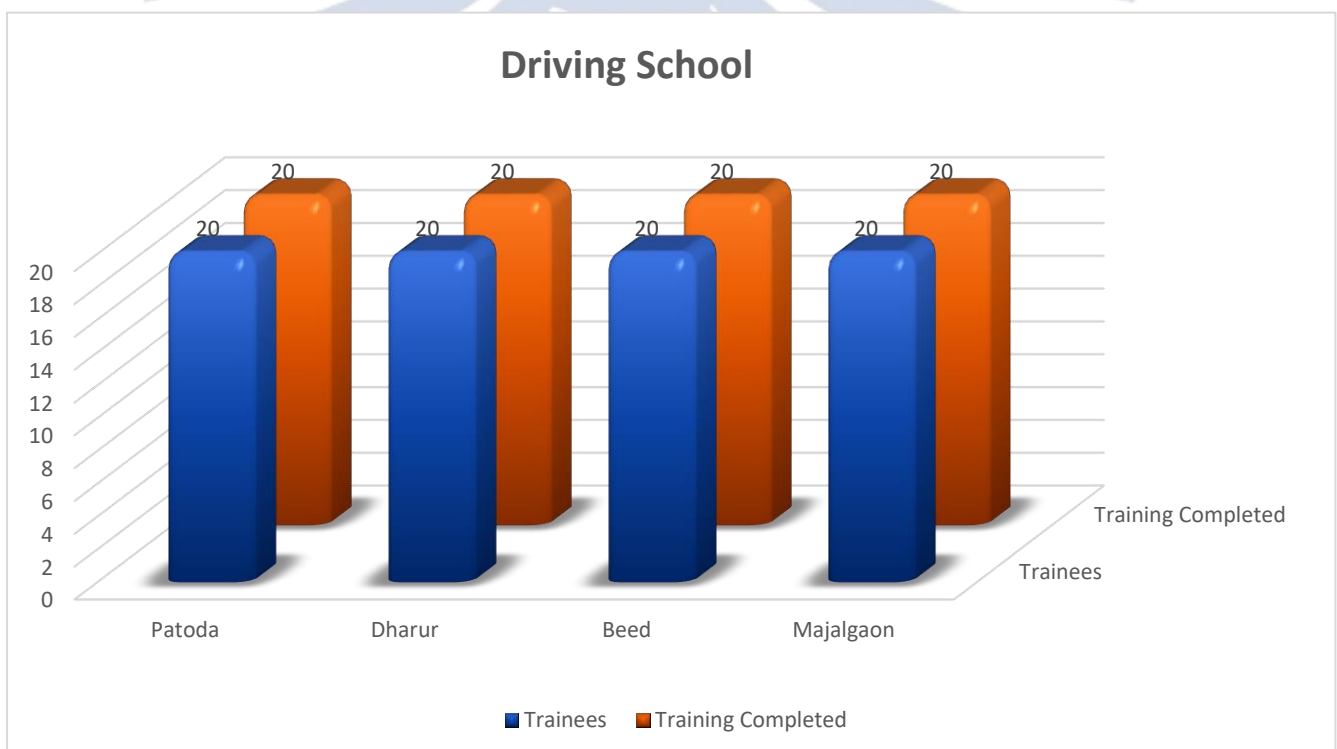

SUCCESS STORY

ATHARVA SANJAY HIWALE

VILLAGE: Patoda, District Beed, Maharashtra.

BACKGROUND

Atharva Sanjay Hiwale is a resident of Patoda, Taluka Patoda, District Beed, Maharashtra. He comes from a financially disadvantaged family that struggled to meet basic household needs. Due to his family's difficult economic condition, he had limited opportunities to acquire employable skills and secure a stable source of income.



INTERVENTION

Wadmavli Lok Vikas Manch, in collaboration with **Vatsalya Trust, Mumbai**, organized a one-month driving skill development program through **Dnyaneshwar Motor Driving School, Patoda**.

AS PART OF THE INITIATIVE:

- Atharva completed one month of professional driving training.
- He successfully obtained a valid driving licence.
- The program equipped him with the skills and confidence required to pursue driving as a profession.

OUTCOME

After completing the training and receiving his driving licence, Atharva purchased a second-hand **Maruti Suzuki Swift Dzire** and started working as a commercial driver by providing taxi services.

Today, after meeting all operating expenses, he earns an average monthly income of **₹15,000–₹20,000**. This steady income has strengthened his family's financial stability and provided them with a dependable source of livelihood.

IMPACT

- The driving skill development program enabled Atharva to:
- Establish a sustainable self-employment opportunity.
- Become financially independent.
- Improve his family's economic condition.
- Lead a life of dignity, confidence, and self-reliance.

CONCLUSION

Atharva's journey demonstrates how skill development and timely support can transform the lives of economically disadvantaged youth. Through the efforts of **Wadmavli Lok Vikas Manch**, in collaboration with **Vatsalya Trust, Mumbai**, and **Dnyaneshwar Motor Driving School, Patoda**, he was able to establish a sustainable livelihood and become self-reliant. His story reflects the lasting impact of vocational training in creating employment opportunities and empowering rural communities.
